JOURNAL OF SYNOD.

ELEVENTH SESSION, 1881.

SPECIAL MEETING of the Synod of the Diocese of Fredericton held in the School Room of Trinity Church in the City of Saint John on Wednesday the 12th day of January, A. D. 1881, at 7 o'clock, P. M.

This Special Meeting is called on a summons from the Bishop of the Diocese by notice given by advertisement in the *Royal Gazette* on Wednesday the 24th day of November last, and continued, as required by section 13 of the Constitution. Such notice being as follows :

"SYNOD MEETING.

"I hereby summon a Special Meeting of the Synod of the Diocese of Fredericton to be held in the School Room of Trinity Church in the City of Saint John on Wednesday the twelfth day of January next, at 7 o'clock, P. M., for the purpose of submitting to the Synod the name of a person to be elected as Bishop Coadjutor, according to the provisions of the Canon for the appointment and election of a Bishop Coadjutor.

(Signed) JOHN FREDERICTON."

"Fredericton, 24th November, 1880."

The Synod met at the appointed time and place.

The Lord Bishop of the Diocese took the Chair.

The Secretary then certified that there was a quorum of both Orders present.

The Lord Bishop addressed the Synod, stating the purpose for which this Special Meeting of the Synod was called, as stated in the summons and notice, and read to the Synod certain letters and testimonials received by him with reference to the Reverend Henry Tully Kingdon, M. A., of Trinity College, Cambridge, and Vicar of Good Easter, Essex, a person in Holy Orders in the Church of England, whom he said he was about to nominate for election as Bishop Coadjutor; and then submitted the name of the Rev. Mr. Kingdon; the nomination being in the following form:

"I herewith submit to the Synod of this Diocese the name of the Reverend Henry Tully Kingdon, M. A., of Trinity College, Cambridge, England, being a Priest in Holy Orders of the Church of England, and Vicar of Good Easter, Essex, for election by the Synod as Bishop Coadjutor of this Diocese, under Section 2 of the Canon passed at the ninth Session (special) of the Synod.

JOHN FREDERICTON."

"St. John, January 12, 1881."

The Bishop said that he would retire from the Chair and Synod for a time, that free and full discussion might be had by the Representatives in Synod on this important subject.

The Bishop then retired.

Moved by Rev. Canon Ketchum, seconded by Mr. Hurd Peters, and put to the Synod by the Secretary,

That the Hon. The Chief Justice take the Chair.

Carried unanimously.

Moved by Rev. L. A. Hoyt, seconded Mr. Hurd Peters, That the Synod proceed to the election of a Bishop Coadjutor of this Diocese forthwith.

Moved, in amendment, by Mr. E. Willis, seconded by Mr. E. B. Chandler,

That the Synod proceed to the election of a Coadjutor Bishop to-morrow morning at ten o'clock.

The question being taken on the amendment, it was

Carried on a division: Yeas 59: Nays 39.

Moved by Mr. G. A. Schofield, seconded by Mr. T. B. Robinson,

That the amendment just passed be reconsidered. *Carried.* The original motion and amendment thereto were now open to discussion, and the debate proceeded.

Moved, in amendment to the amendment, by Mr. C. H. Fairweather, seconded by Mr. E. J. Wetmore,

Resolved, That this Synod adjourn to the first Tuesday in March next, then to meet in this place for the purpose of proceeding to the election of a Coadjutor Bishop.

On motion, the debate is adjourned until to-morrow morning at ten o'clock.

The Synod then adjourned until to-morrow (Thursday) morning at ten o'clock.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 13th, 1881.

The Synod met, pursuant to adjournment.

The Hon. Chief Justice Allen in the Chair.

Prayers were said by the Secretary.

The roll of the Clergy and Lay Representatives was called and the attendance marked.

A quorum of both Orders was present.

Debate was resumed on the motion and amendments before the Synod at its adjournment.

Moved by Rev. Canon Ketchum, seconded by Mr. T. Odell,

That this Synod adjourn till two o'clock.

Question being taken, this motion was *Lost.*

The question being taken on the amendment to the amendment, it was *Lost.*

The amendment being necessarily withdrawn, the question was taken on the original motion; it is *Carried*, and it is

Resolved, That the Synod proceed to the election of a Bishop Coadjutor of this Diocese forthwith.

On motion, the Synod adjourned until this afternoon at two o'clock.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

The Synod met, pursuant to adjournment.

The Lord Bishop, now being present, took the Chair.

In accordance with the Resolution adopted this morning, the Synod proceeded to the election of a Bishop Coadjutor.

The Chairman appointed Rev. Canon Brigstocke, Rev. E. S. W. Pentreath, Messrs. G. Herbert Lee and G. A. Schofield, Tellers to collect, count, and report the ballot.

The Tellers reported the result of the ballot as follows:

Clerical Vote.—Total number of ballots cast 49: Yeas 44: Nays 5.

Lay Vote.—Total number of ballots cast 45: Yeas 42: Nays 3.

Whereupon the Reverend Henry Tully Kingdon, M. A., of Trinity College, Cambridge, and Vicar of Good Easter, Essex, was declared duly elected Bishop Coadjutor for the Diocese of Fredericton.

On motion of Rev. E. S. W. Pentreath, seconded by Mr. W. M. Jarvis,

The election was made unanimous by a standing vote of the Synod.

The Synod then sang the Doxology; after which the Lord Bishop addressed the Synod, congratulating the members upon the result of their labours.

Moved by Rev. Canon Ketchum, seconded by Rev. Canon DeVeber,

That the best thanks of this Synod be tendered to the Rector and Church Wardens of Trinity Church for the use of their Rooms for the present meetings. *Carried.*

Moved by Mr. G. A. Schofield, seconded by Mr. T. B. Robinson,

That the Secretary of the Synod be directed to send the formal notice to the Metropolitan of the election of the Bishop Coadjutor, as required under the 8th Section of the Canon. *Carried.*

Moved by Rev. Canon Brigstocke, seconded by Mr. G. A. Schofield,

That the Metropolitan be requested to forward by telegraph to the Rev. H. T. Kingdon his unanimous election by the Synod to the office of Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese.

Carried.

The Lord Bishop having pronounced the Benediction, on motion, the Synod adjourned.

I do not like Mr. Kingdon to leave England, after working nearly nine years in my Diocese, without offering to you my testimony to his ability and acquirements, his quiet energy, and his unassuming worth. You have chosen a Coadjutor on whose sound judgment, and loyalty to the Church and yourself, you may confidently rely. He will carry with him the warm wishes and prayers of many in England.

His Lordship also read two letters identifying Dr. Kingdon with the Vicar of Good Easter, Essex; one from Rev. B. Webb, Vicar of St. Andrews, Wells street, London; the other from the Dean of St. Paul's.

*Extract of a letter from Rev. B. Webb, Vicar of St. Andrews,
Wells Street, London.*

"March 17, 1881.

"My dear friend and former Curate, Hollingworth Tully Kingdon, has been for the last two or three years Vicar of Good Easter, in Essex, to which living the Dean of St. Paul's presented him. He is still Vicar there; and is M. A. of Trinity College, Cambridge. On the 10th inst. he was made D. D. by the University of Cambridge, as being Coadjutor elect of Fredericton."

From the Dean of St. Paul's.

ST. PAUL'S DEANERY, March 17, 1881.

I, Richard William Church, Dean of St. Paul's, London, certify that the Rev. Hollingworth Tully Kingdon is well known to me; that he was some time Curate at St. Andrews, Wells street, London; that he is M. A. of Trinity College, Cambridge, (I believe he has recently taken his D. D. degree there); that he was, March 26, 1878, presented by the Dean and Chapter of St. Paul's, at my recommendation, to the Vicarage of Good Easter, in the County of Essex and Diocese of St. Alban's; and that he was Vicar of Good Easter on January 13th, 1881.

R. W. CHURCH, Dean of St. Paul's.

The Bishop stated that he had taken counsel on the matter with those most competent to advise him, and read the following Address:

In submitting to the Synod at the Special Meeting held in Saint John in the month of January last, the name of Rev. Mr. Kingdon, M. A., of Trinity College, Cambridge, and Vicar of Good Easter, Essex, for election to the office of Bishop Coadjutor, I stated Mr. Kingdon's name as "Henry" Tully, his name being, in fact, "Hollingworth" Tully.

I have now to request that the Synod will take such steps as may be necessary to correct the misnomer, and to ratify and confirm the election of the Rev. Hollingworth Tully Kingdon as Bishop Coadjutor of this Diocese, he being in fact the person nominated by me at such meeting.

I have also to inform the Synod that the Bishops of the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada, having received due notice, under the Canon, of the election of Rev. H. T. Kingdon as Bishop Coadjutor, have signified to me their assent and consent to his Consecration, and I having informed them of the misnomer, they have given their consent to the consecration of the Reverend Hollingworth Tully Kingdon.

Moved by Mr. C. W. Weldon, seconded by Mr. Justice Wilkinson,

That the Address just read be entered on the Minutes.

Carried.

The Minutes of the eleventh Session of the Synod (the Special Session of January 12th and 13th, 1881, electing Rev. Mr. Kingdon as Bishop Coadjutor) were now read.

Moved by Hon. Chief Justice Allen, seconded by Mr. C. W. Weldon,

WHEREAS at a Special Meeting of the Synod of Fredericton held in the City of St. John on the 12th and 13th days of January last, under the provisions of the Canon for the appointment and election of a Bishop Coadjutor, the Rev. Mr. Kingdon, M. A., of Trinity College, Cambridge, and Vicar of Good Easter, Essex, in England, was nominated by His Lordship the Bishop for election as Bishop Coadjutor of this Diocese, by the name of "Henry Tully Kingdon," and by that name was elected Bishop Coadjutor;

And whereas it has since been ascertained that the name of the Rev. Mr. Kingdon is "Hollingworth Tully," and not "Henry Tully," as stated at such nomination;

And whereas no doubt exists that the nomination intended, and the election made thereon, was that of the Reverend Hollingworth Tully Kingdon, then being the Vicar of Good Easter in Essex; and that the describing him as "Henry Tully" did not in any way affect the identity of the person intended to be nominated, and so elected by the Synod; and so far as can be ascertained, there is no such person as Henry Tully Kingdon in Holy Orders in the Church of England;

And whereas it is desirable to remove any doubt which might exist as to the validity of the election of the said Rev. Hollingworth Tully Kingdon as Bishop Coadjutor, in consequence of the error in his first Christian name;

Therefore Resolved, and it is hereby declared that, notwithstanding the said error in his Christian name, the Reverend Hollingworth Tully Kingdon, then being Vicar of Good Easter in Essex, was in fact the person nominated as Bishop Coadjutor at the said meeting of the Synod held on the twelfth and thirteenth days of January last, and was, in fact, the person elected by the said meeting as Bishop Coadjutor of this Diocese, and that the election of the said Hollingworth Tully Kingdon as such Bishop Coadjutor is hereby ratified and confirmed.

And further Resolved, That except so far as relates to the error in the Christian name of the Rev. Mr. Kingdon, the Minutes of the said meeting of the twelfth and thirteenth of January last are hereby confirmed. *Carried unanimously.*

Moved by Mr. G. Sidney Smith, seconded by Mr. T. B. Robinson,

That the Rev. Hollingworth Tully Kingdon, Coadjutor Bishop elect of this Diocese, be immediately notified of the confirmation of his election, and be requested to take a seat in this Synod. *Carried unanimously.*

The Chairman appointed the Rev. Canon Medley and Mr. G. D. Street a deputation to wait on Rev. Dr. Kingdon, in accordance with the above resolution.

The Rev. Canon Medley and Mr. G. D. Street then introduced Rev. Dr. Kingdon, who was received by the Synod standing and warmly welcomed by the Bishop, and who returned thanks in a deeply feeling address.

Rev. T. E. Dowling presented and read the Report of the Board of Foreign Missions, and moved That the Report be adopted and printed in the Journal of Synod, with the Treasurer's Accounts. *Carried.*

**SEVENTH REPORT
OF THE
BOARD OF FOREIGN MISSIONS
FOR THE DIOCESE OF FREDERICTON.**

(Established by the Diocesan Synod A. D. 1874.)

To the Diocesan Synod of Fredericton:

The Board of Foreign Missions beg to submit the following Report:

Remittances 1880-1881.—During the past year the Board has remitted the sum of \$876.70 to the four Missionary objects directed by the donors, the full details of which are submitted herewith in the Treasurer's Account (see Appendix), which has been distributed as follows:

Annual Meeting.—The sixth Annual Missionary Meeting of the Board was held in Trinity School House, St. John, on Monday evening, June 28, under the Presidency of the Bishop. A financial statement was made by the Treasurer, and addresses were delivered by the Reverend Canon Partridge, Messrs. George A. Schofield and O. R. Arnold.

The Provincial Synod's Board of Missions.—The Provincial Synod, last September, appointed two Boards of Missions, of which the Metropolitan is President, and all the Bishops of the Ecclesiastical Province Vice-Presidents. One Board was named for Foreign Mission work, and the other for Domestic Missions.

Each of these Boards is to have a Corresponding Committee in the several Dioceses, the members of these latter being named by the Bishop of each Diocese until the meeting of the Diocesan Synod should occur, when the members should be elected.

The Bishop at once appointed the Revs. Geo. M. Armstrong, Dr.

Ketchum, G. G. Roberts, and Messrs. G. W. Whitney, G. R. Parkin, T. W. Daniel, the Corresponding Committee of the Central Board of Foreign Missions; and the Revs. Canon Brigstocke, Canon Partridge, T. E. Dowling, Messrs. H. W. Frith, W. M. Jarvis, and G. A. Schofield the Corresponding Committee of the Board of Domestic Missions.

By *Foreign Missions* is understood all Mission work in heathen countries outside the Dominion.

By *Domestic Missions*, work within the Dominion of Canada, including Algoma and the North West, but outside the organized Dioceses in connection with the Provincial Synod of Canada.

Both these fields of labour have hitherto been within the province of this Diocesan Board of Foreign Missions.

The Diocesan Board having already commenced their duties for the year, at the time that the Corresponding Committees referred to were appointed, it has not been thought necessary that they should cease to perform those duties before the meeting of the Synod. They have therefore continued to receive such contributions for Foreign Mission purposes as have been sent them, and await the determination of the Synod as to the best method of aiding Foreign Mission work.

The Day of Intercession.—The Board printed and issued a Circular to the Clergy of the Diocese from the Bishop, drawing attention to the observance of the Day of Intercession for Missions on May 24th.

Missionary Publications.—The Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts have lately improved the *Mission Field*, published monthly at two-pence each number; and the same Society's *Gospel Missionary*, a monthly half-penny publication, is now issued in a more attractive form. The *Church Missionary Gleaner* is beautifully illustrated, and the *Juvenile Instructor* is also a marvel of cheapness.

Messrs. McMillan, of St. John, will gladly attend to orders for these and other Missionary publications.

The *Algoma Missionary News and Shingwauk Journal* will be mailed to any address for 35 cents per annum, upon application to the Editor, the Rev. E. F. Wilson, Sault St. Marie, Ontario.

Diocesan Collections for S. P. G.—On May 2nd, 1881, the Bishop reminded the Clergy that "it is required by the S. P. G. that a collection should be made in every Parish aided by its help, towards its Foreign Missions."

The following is the list of Parishes that have contributed to the S. P. G. during the financial year from June 28th 1880, to June 30th 1881: Andover, Bathurst, Bay du Vin, Burton, Campobello, Canterbury, Chatham, Fredericton (Cathedral), Fredericton (Christ Church), Gagetown, Greenwich, Hampton, Kingsclear, Manguerville, Musquash, New Den-

mark, Petitcodiac, Point du Chene, Portland (St. Paul's), St. John (Trinity), St. George's, Carleton, Fairville, St. Martins, Springfield and Upper Norton, Sussex, Upham, Waterford, Weldon, Westfield, Wicklow, Woodstock, St. Andrews and Chamcook (limited to Algoma).

We regret to add that twenty-four Parishes have made no contribution to the Venerable Society during this year.

The Rev. G. M. Armstrong presented and read the Report of the Corresponding Committee in connection with the Central Board of Foreign Missions of Provincial Synod, and moved that it be received. *Carried.*

The Secretary laid on the table the Accounts of the Contingent Fund. The Chair appointed Mr. E. J. Wetmore a committee to audit the same.

The following notices of motion were given :

By Mr. W. M. Jarvis, with respect to Coadjutor Bishop.

By Rev. E. S. W. Pentreath, on Permanent Diaconate.

By Mr. G. R. Parkin, with reference to Free Churches.

Moved by Mr. E. B. Chandler, that his resolution on page 20 of the last Journal of Synod be now confirmed, viz :

Moved by Mr. E. B. Chandler, seconded by Mr. G. A. Schofield,

That in order to entitle a Substitute to sit in Synod, the inability of the regularly elected Delegate to attend shall be certified by the Rector or Missionary in charge to the Secretary of the Synod, before such Substitute take his seat. *Carried.*

Moved by Rev. H. H. Barber, seconded by Rev. J. Rushton,

That the amendments to the Articles of the Constitution on pages 19 and 20 of the Journal of the tenth Session be confirmed.

These amendments, like the one immediately preceding, were passed at the last Session by a majority of both Orders, and are now offered for confirmation, as required by the Constitution.

1. That Article I. of the Constitution be amended by adding the words "The Bishop Coadjutor" after the word "Diocese."
2. That Article I. of the Constitution be amended by adding the words "and resident in the Diocese" after the words "licensed by the Bishop."
3. That Article XIV. of the Constitution be amended by adding the words "The Bishop Coadjutor" after the words "when the Bishop is not present," and the same words after the words "and in case of the absence of," and omitting the word "both."

The confirmation of these three amendments to the Constitution was then taken up and debated. Nos. 1 and 3 were confirmed. To No. 2, it was moved in amendment by Mr. C. H. Fairweather, seconded by Mr. C. W. Weldon,

That the motion to confirm the change of Constitution now under consideration be postponed until the next annual meeting of the Synod. *Lost.*

The original motion was put, and *Carried.*

Moved by Rev. H. H. Barber, seconded by Rev. J. H. Talbot,

That the Rev. Canon Scovil be invited to take a seat on the floor of this Synod. *Carried.*

Moved by Rev. Canon Partridge,

That the next Annual Meeting of this Synod be held in Trinity Church School House in the City of St. John on the Wednesday before the first Thursday in July, 1882. *Carried.*

That Article XI. of the Constitution be amended by inserting the words "or mental incapacity" after the words "in case of his absence."

Lost.

Mr. E. J. Wetmore made a verbal report that he had audited the Accounts of the Secretary, and found them quite correct, and with vouchers in proper order.

On motion, Synod adjourned to 3 o'clock P. M.

Synod met pursuant to adjournment.

Rev. E. S. W. Pentreath presented and read the Report of the Committee on Sunday Schools, and moved, seconded by Mr. E. J. Wetmore,

That it be received and entered on the Minutes. *Carried.*

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

The Committee on Sunday Schools beg leave to report as follows:

During the past year some progress has been made in the organization of the Sunday School work of the Diocese. The Sunday School Association of the Deanery of Shediac has become affiliated with the Church of England Sunday School Institute, and has arranged for the half-yearly inspection of the Schools,—is looking forward to uniform lessons, and expects to have several Teachers ready next Spring for the Examination prescribed by the Institute.

The Deanery of Woodstock expects to have the Sunday Schools within its limits organized into an Association by August.

Your Committee note with pleasure that several Teachers from the St. John Association have presented themselves for examination.

Your Committee would recommend that the important work among the young in this Diocese should command a portion of the time of this Synod each year, in such way as the Synod shall direct, either by the continuance of a Committee entrusted with the furtherance of Sunday School work, or in some other practical manner.

Your Committee, having considered the suggestion of the Bishop in his Charge in reference to the compilation of a Form for Children's Services, beg leave to say, that there are several admirable Services published by the S. P. C. K., the Church of England Sunday School Institute, and other Societies, endorsed by many of the English Bishops. But your Committee believe that the best interests of the Church would be promoted by the use of the Shortened form for Evening Prayer

where Children's Services are maintained, in order, among other things, to familiarize the children of the Church with the Services of the Prayer Book, the Bishop being asked to allow the use of special Psalms and Lessons.

Fenety, In Article II. of the Constitution to strike out the words "and residents" to "attendants," and substitute the words "and at least one lay representative from each Parish shall be resident in the Parish for which he is elected, or a stated attendant at some church or chapel of ease in the same."

After some debate this resolution was, by consent,

Withdrawn.

Unfinished business being now in order, it was

Moved by Mr. W. M. Jarvis, seconded by Mr. E. B. Chandler, That the proposed codification and amendment of the Church Acts contained in the Appendix to the Journal of 1878 be read, and taken into consideration section by section.

Moved by Rev. Canon Brigstocke, seconded by Rev. Canon Partridge,

That the standing orders be suspended, and that the motion of W. M. Jarvis, Esq., touching the Codification of Acts relating to the Church be taken first in order to-morrow morning.

Carried.

Rev. Canon Brigstocke, Rev. G. M. Armstrong, and W. M. Jarvis, Esq. were then, on motion, appointed to prepare the question of the Corresponding Committees of this Diocese in connection with the Central Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions of the Provincial Synod, for submitting to the Synod to-morrow morning.

On motion, the Synod adjourned to 10 o'clock to-morrow, Thursday, morning.

SECOND DAY'S PROCEEDINGS.

THURSDAY, JULY 7, 1881.

The Synod met, pursuant to adjournment.

The Lord Bishop in the Chair.

Prayers.

The roll of Clergy and Laity was called, and the attendance marked.

The minutes of the previous day's proceedings were read, and, on motion, confirmed.

The Rev. G. M. Armstrong presented and read the Report of the Committee on the Central Board of Missions of the Provincial Synod, and moved that it be received. *Carried.*

The Resolution of Mr. W. M. Jarvis with respect to the Codification of the Acts of Assembly relating to the Church, is now before the House:

That the proposed codification and amendment of the Church Acts contained in the Appendix to the Journal of

this Synod for 1878, be read, and taken into consideration section by section.

Moved in amendment, by Mr. G. R. Parkin, seconded by Rev. J. Roy Campbell,

Whereas, The powers vested in the Synod by the Act of Assembly incorporating the same have not been found sufficient to prevent frequent applications to the Legislature for the due management of the affairs of the Church ;

And whereas, It is desirable that full power to regulate and control such affairs should be vested in Synod ;

Therefore Resolved, That it be referred to a Committee to prepare a Bill to vest such powers in this Synod, and to repeal such Acts or portions of Acts as may be inconsistent with such Bill ; such Bill to be reported to this Synod before being submitted to the Legislature.

Debate continued until 4 p. m., when, on motion of Hon. D. Hanington, seconded by Mr. W. M. Jarvis, the Synod took recess until 4.15.

At 4.15 p. m. the Synod resumed work.

Mr. Parkin's amendment being put, on a division it was *Lost: yeas 23: nays 47.*

At 5 p. m. the Bishop retired from the Chair, and on motion, the Rev. G. M. Armstrong took the same.

The original motion of Mr. W. M. Jarvis was then put to the house, and *Carried.*

On motion, the Synod adjourned till to-morrow, Friday, at 10.30 A. M.

Moved by the same, seconded by Mr. G. S. Grimmer,

That Section 3 be passed, with the addition of the following words, after the word Bishop, "Coadjutor Bishop, if any."

Carried.

Mr. C. W. Weldon, seconded by Mr. E. B. Chandler, moved a reconsideration of Section 2. *Carried.*

Mr. Weldon then moved the following addition to the Section :

Provided however that all Delegates or Representatives elected to sit in the Synod shall be communicants of the Church of England and residents of the Parish for which they are elected, or stated attendants of some church or chapel within the same. *Carried on a division: yeas 61: nays 15.*

The Secretary read the provisions under the second head, entitled "Diocesan Church Society," Secs. 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10.

Moved by Mr. Jarvis, seconded by Hon. D. Hanington,

That Section 4 be passed.

Moved in amendment, by Rev. L. A. Hoyt, seconded by Hon. Judge Wilkinson,

That Sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, under the title "Diocesan Church Society," be referred to a Committee to prepare a draft of a Chapter to be presented to the Synod, by which the properties and trusts and all other resources and liabilities of the Diocesan Church Society may be placed under the direct control and management of the Synod of this Diocese. *Lost.*

The original motion was put, and *carried*, and Section 4 is passed.

On motion of Mr. Jarvis, seconded by Mr. T. B. Robinson, Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, were put and *carried*.

Mr. Jarvis, seconded by Mr. G. Sidney Smith, moved That Section 9 be passed, with the following alteration: "Any Province within the said Dominion of Canada," instead of the words "this Province" at the end of the Section. *Carried.*

Section 10 was then, on motion of the same, passed.

The Secretary then read the Sections under the third head, entitled "The Bishop of Fredericton."

On motion of Mr. Jarvis, seconded by Mr. T. B. Robinson, Sections 11 and 12 were carried.

Moved by Mr. Jarvis, seconded by Mr. Robinson, That Section 13 be passed.

Moved in amendment, by Hon. Judge Wilkinson, seconded by Mr. G. S. Smith,

That after the word "execute" in Section 13, there be added "under the corporate seal of the said See;" also, that in the 7th line from the bottom the word "lately" be omitted. *Carried.*

Mr. Jarvis moved, seconded as before, That Section 14 be passed. *Carried.*

Mr. C. W. Weldon, seconded by Hon. D. Hanington, moved the following as Section 15:

15. In order to remove any doubt that may be raised as to the election of the Rev. Hollingworth Tully Kingdon, D. D., as Coadjutor Bishop of the Diocese of Fredericton in January 1881, which election was ratified at the annual meeting of the Diocesan Synod in the July following, the said election is hereby ratified and confirmed, and the said Reverend Hollingworth Tully Kingdon is declared to be Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese of Fredericton, with right of succession. *Carried.*

Mr. Jarvis moved, seconded by Mr. Robinson, the following as Section 16:

16. No person shall be capable to be admitted to any Parsonage or ecclesiastical Benefice or promotion in the Church

of England in Canada within the Province of New Brunswick but such as shall be in Priest's orders of the Church of England or some Church in communion therewith, and shall be duly licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese of Fredericton, and shall also conform to and consent in writing to be bound by the Book of Common Prayer and the Articles of the said Church. *Carried.*

At 3 P. M. Rev. Canon Brigstocke moved, seconded by Mr. E. B. Chandler,

That the standing orders be suspended, and that the Report of the Committee touching the Board of Missions be considered. *Lost.*

Moved by Mr. W. M. Jarvis, seconded by Hon. Judge Wilkinson,

That Section 17 be passed, with the addition of the words "Coadjutor Bishop or" before the words "Ecclesiastical Commissary." *Carried.*

On motion of Mr. Jarvis, seconded as before, Sections 18 and 19 were put, and *Carried.*

Moved and seconded by the same, That Section 20 be passed.

Moved in amendment, by Rev. L. A. Hoyt, seconded by Hon. Judge Wilkinson,

That in Section 20 the words from "being pew owners," in the second line, to "over such age" in the fourth line; and the words from "provided" in the thirteenth line, to "arrears and" in the seventeenth line, both inclusive; and that the word "also" in the seventeenth line be erased.

Carried on a division: yeas 34: nays 24.

Moved by Mr. W. M. Jarvis, seconded by Mr. E. B. Chandler,

That the further consideration of the proposed measure be taken up at the next annual session of the Diocesan Synod.

Moved in amendment, by Rev. J. R. Campbell, seconded by Rev. R. E. Smith,

That the debate continue.

The question being taken on the amendment, it was

Carried on a division: yeas 35: nays 25.

Moved by Rev. F. S. Sill, seconded by Hon. D. Hanington, That the amendment to Section 20 (*printed 19*) be reconsidered.

Attention being called to the 15th Rule of Order of this Synod, which provides that a question being once determined, shall not be again drawn into discussion without consent of the Chair; the Chairman gave his sanction to the reconsideration.

At this point the Bishop left the Synod for a short period, and, on motion, Mr. G. S. Grimmer took the Chair.

The question being taken on the motion for reconsideration, it was *Carried on a division: yeas 42: nays 15.*

The Rev. L. A. Hoyt then withdrew his amendment.

Section 20, as moved by Mr. Jarvis, is now again before the Synod.

Moved in amendment, by Hon. D. Hanington, seconded by Mr. G. E. Fenety,

In Section 20, after the word "of," to strike out the word "male."

The Lord Bishop here returned to the Synod, and introduced to the house, in a graceful speech, the Right Rev. Wm. Croswell Doane, D. D., Bishop of Albany, U. S., whom the Synod received standing.

The Bishop of Albany returned thanks for his cordial reception by the Synod, and being tired with his long journey, retired, the Bishop of the Diocese accompanying him.

Hon. D. Hanington's amendment to Section 20 was put to the house, and *Lost.*

The original motion was then put, and *Carried.*

Section 21 was moved by Mr. Jarvis, seconded by Mr. W. J. Gilbert, with the addition of the words "Bishop Coadjutor" after the words "Bishop of the Diocese." *Carried.*

Sections 22, 23, 24, 25 were then moved, and *Carried.*

Moved by Mr. Jarvis, seconded by Hon. D. Hanington,

That this debate be postponed until 9.30 o'clock to-morrow morning. *Carried.*

Mr. Jarvis moved his resolution, of which he had given notice,

That the following alterations be made in that part of the Constitution relating to the Standing Committee. (See Journal of 1875, p. 8.) In clause 1, after the word "who" insert the words "together with the Bishop Coadjutor and Archdeacon, if any." In clause 4, at the commencement, insert the words "the Bishop Coadjutor or the Archdeacon, if any, and if there shall be neither Bishop Coadjutor nor Archdeacon."

Carried by a large majority of both Orders.

This alteration of the Constitution stands over to the next meeting of the Synod for confirmation.

Moved by Rev. Canon Brigstocke, seconded by Mr. G. Sidney Smith,

That this Synod present, on behalf of this Diocese, an Address of Welcome to Rev. Hollingworth Tully Kingdon, D. D. on his becoming the Bishop Coadjutor of this Diocese; and that a Committee be appointed to prepare the same, and make all necessary and suitable arrangements for its due presentation at the earliest opportunity. *Carried.*

The Chair then appointed the following such Committee:

Revs. Canon Medley, Canon Brigstocke, Canon Ketchum, Canon DeVeber, James Neales; Hon. Chief Justice Allen, Lieut. Gov. Wilmot, Messrs. E. B. Chandler, W. M. Jarvis, G. D. Street.

Moved by Mr. T. B. Robinson, seconded by Rev. Canon Medley,

That the Rev. Canon Partridge be requested to accept \$50, as a partial indemnity for his expenses in attendance upon his duties as Secretary of this Synod. *Carried.*

Moved by Rev. E. S. W. Pentreath, seconded by Rev. G. G. Roberts,

Whereas, The Provincial Synod at its last session unanimously passed a Canon providing for the admission of Laymen as Permanent Deacons, without relinquishment of their secular calling;

And whereas, Such an order of men would lead to the growth and organization of the Church in this Diocese;

Therefore Resolved, That a Committee be appointed to re-

port at the next Synod a Canon regulating the qualifications and other matters pertaining to such office; and in the meantime, this Synod would earnestly invite God-fearing and zealous men to offer themselves for the work.

Moved by Rev. F. S. Sill,

That this motion stand over for consideration until to-morrow morning.

Carried.

Rev. Canon Brigstocke read the Report of the Committee on the Boards of Missions of the Provincial Synod, and moved that it be adopted, and that the Synod proceed to the election of the Board of Foreign Missions by nomination and ballot.

Carried.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON BOARDS OF MISSIONS OF PROVINCIAL SYNOD.

Whereas, The Provincial Synod at its session held in September 1880, with a view of extending the Church of England throughout the Canadian North-west Territories, as well as of promoting Missionary work throughout the world, did form two Central Boards for Foreign and Domestic Missions respectively, with Corresponding Committees in each Diocese of this Ecclesiastical Province;

And whereas, It is desirable that the Mission work of the Church within this Ecclesiastical Province should now be carried on through those Central Boards;

Therefore Resolved, That, without interfering with the Board of Foreign Missions of this Diocese as already constituted, beyond limiting their duties to the aiding of Mission work among the Jews and Heathen in countries outside the Dominion, and reducing the numbers of the Board to three Clerical and three Lay members, a second Standing Committee shall be annually appointed in like manner, to be called "The Board of Domestic Missions," whose operations shall extend to all Mission work within the Dominion of Canada outside the organized Dioceses; and that the Boards shall act as Corresponding Committees with the Central Boards of Foreign and Domestic Missions established at Montreal.

2. That the Board of Foreign Missions of this Diocese do hereafter consist of the Lord Bishop and three Clergymen and three Laymen of the Diocese, and their duties shall be, in future, limited as hereinbefore stated.

3. That the Rules already adopted for the formation and guidance of the Diocesan Board of Foreign Missions, except as herein altered, do extend to and govern the Diocesan Board of Domestic Missions hereby constituted.

4. That there shall be, so soon as possible after the Annual Meeting of the Synod in each year, a joint meeting of the said Boards, which shall be summoned by the Lord Bishop, at which a joint Secretary and Treasurer for both Boards shall be appointed.

5. That such Boards shall report through the Diocesan Synod, and through the Central Boards at Montreal to the Provincial Synod.

FOURTH DAY'S PROCEEDINGS.

SATURDAY, July 9th, 1881.

The Synod met, pursuant to adjournment, at 9.30 A. M.

The Rev. Canon Medley stated that the Bishop was unable to be present, but would be present at 12 o'clock to close the Synod.

On motion, the Rev. Canon DeVeber took the Chair.

Prayers were said by the Secretary.

The roll of Clergy and Laity was called, and the attendance marked.

The minutes of the previous day's proceedings were read, and, on motion, confirmed.

Moved by Mr. G. Sidney Smith, seconded by Mr. W. M. Jarvis,

Whereas His Lordship the Bishop has intimated his intention of being present at or about 12 o'clock for the purpose of closing the proceedings of the Synod, should the business be in a position to admit of his doing so;

Resolved therefore, That the business of the Synod be suspended at or about that hour, and that His Lordship be respectfully informed that the Synod will be prepared for adjournment at that time. *Carried.*

Moved by Mr. W. M. Jarvis, seconded by Mr. E. B. Chandler,

That the debate on the Codification of the Laws relating to the Church be postponed, to be taken up as unfinished business at the next meeting of the Synod. *Carried.*

Moved by Mr. Jarvis, seconded by Rev. Canon Medley,

That the Bishop Coadjutor be a member *ex officio* of the Boards of Foreign and Domestic Missions respectively. *Carried.*

Moved by Rev. E. S. W. Pentreath, seconded by Rev. E. P. Flewelling,

That a Committee of four Clergymen and four Laymen, together with the Bishop Coadjutor, be appointed to carry out the spirit of the resolution proposed yesterday on the Permanent Diaconate. *Carried.*

Moved by Rev. W. LeB. McKiel, seconded by Rev. J. Roy Campbell,

That the Rev. L. Wilkins, of the Diocese of Nova Scotia, now present, be invited to take a seat on the floor of the house. *Carried.*

Moved by Rev. Canon Ketchum, seconded by Rev. Canon Partridge,

That the thanks of the Synod be tendered to the proprietors of the lines of Railways and Steamers for the return fare granted to the Delegates.

And further Resolved, That the Synod desires to tender most sincere thanks for the kind and generous hospitality on the part of members of the Church in Fredericton; also to the Odd Fellows for the free use of their Hall for the meetings of Synod; also, to the members of the press, and especially to the *Globe* newspaper for the gratuitous distribution of papers during the session. *Carried unanimously.*

Moved by Mr. W. M. Jarvis, seconded by Rev. E. S. W. Pentreath,

That the Committee on Sunday Schools be reappointed, to consist of the same members as the Committee which reported at the present meeting of the Synod, with the exception of substituting the name of Mr. G. Herbert Lee for that of Mr. G. A. Schofield. *Carried.*

On motion, the Rev. Messrs. Godfrey, Shreve, and Snyder, of the Diocese of Nova Scotia, were invited to seats on the floor of the Synod.

The following gentlemen were appointed the Committee on the Permanent Diaconate, in accordance with Rev. Mr. Pentreath's motion:

Whereas, It seems more in accord with the teaching of Scripture, with the practice of the Primitive Church, and with the system of the Church of England, that consecrated places of worship should be free, on equal terms to rich and poor alike, and that seats in them should not be subject to any conditions of purchase and sale; therefore

Resolved, That, in the opinion of this Synod, it is desirable that the sittings in all the Churches of this Diocese should be free and unappropriated, and that the members of the Church

will serve her best interests, and forward the cause of Christianity by earnestly endeavouring to bring about this result.

Carried by a very large majority.

Moved by Rev. Canon Partridge, seconded by Rev. T. E. Dowling,

Whereas, It is found impracticable, in the present state and prospects of the finances of this Diocese to establish a Divinity School in connection with this Synod;

And whereas, The University of King's College, Windsor, is in danger, by reason of the withdrawal of State aid, of being seriously crippled in its work, if not of ceasing to exist as a University;

And whereas, That institution is the only distinctively Church University in the Maritime Provinces; and it is highly advisable that its present state of efficiency should not, in the interests of the Church, be allowed to be impaired;

Therefore Resolved, That this Synod, recognizing the need of preserving intact the ancient rights and privileges of that University, and of maintaining the connection of the Christian Faith with higher education, desires to support it with such moral and material aid as may be possible; and recommends that such Divinity Students as desire it should be encouraged to pursue their studies there.

Moved in amendment, by Mr. E. B. Chandler, seconded by Mr. G. R. Parkin,

That at this late stage of the session, in so thin a house, and with the Bishop not in the Chair, it is not expedient to pledge the Synod in the manner proposed.

After debate, both resolution and amendment were, by consent, *withdrawn*.

The Lord Bishop then entered the Synod, accompanied by the Bishop of Albany, and introduced to the Synod, in a speech of welcome, the Right Rev. Bishop Williams, D.D., of Quebec. His Lordship afterwards congratulated the Synod on the harmony which had prevailed during the session, and especially in the proceedings relating to the Bishop Coadjutor.

The Right Rev. the Bishop of Quebec having made a cordial and most happy reply, the Synod sang the doxology.

By request of the Bishop of the Diocese, the Bishop of Quebec pronounced the Benediction, and the Synod adjourned.

Tenth Session (Journal, p. 2)—That in order to entitle a Substitute to sit in this Synod, the inability of the regularly elected Delegate to attend shall be certified by the Rector or Missionary in charge to the Secretary of the Synod, before such Substitute takes his seat.
